Two major components of the Stormwater Program

Regulatory

- 1. Public Education and Outreach: *Providing materials/events to educate the public about the actions they can take to reduce or eliminate stormwater pollution.*
- 2. Public Involvement: *Getting the public involved in the stormwater program.*
- 3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Program: A codified program that inspects and removes illicit and illegal discharges into the storm sewer system.
- 4. Sediment and Erosion Control Program: A codified program that addresses sediment pollution at construction sites. Includes a review, inspection, and enforcement of this program.
- 5. Stormwater Management at new development and re-development program: A codified program that requires stormwater management controls at new development and re-development sites. Includes a review, inspection, and enforcement of this program.
- 6. Good Housekeeping at municipal facilities. *Maintaining our own facilities in a way that reduces or eliminates stormwater pollution.*
- 7. Record keeping of all activities. *Annual report of activities goes to WVDEP*.

Infrastructure

- 1. Inspection of storm system: Field crews that physically inspect catch basins, pipes, and other storm system structures for an assessment of problems. Also, respond to citizen complaints about possible problems.
- 2. Routine maintenance of storm system: Remove dirt, leaves, debris from catch basins and pipes to increase the capacity. Also, perform minor repairs to any storm system structure.
- 3. Replacement and major repairs of storm system: Replacement or repair of crushed pipes, broken catch basins, grates, fixing sinkholes resulting from storm system pipes that have collapsed.
- 4. Capital improvement projects: New storm sewers or major replacements and relocation of storm lines, or separation of sanitary and storm. Including the engineering and design of the capital improvement projects.
